Partners In Learning is a non-profit organization that serves as the Model Inclusive Center providing early care and education to children six weeks through 12 years of age in Rowan County. Our community impact program provide comprehensive center, community-based, and home-based services to families in Rowan and the and surrounding Counties. Our mission is to model the highest quality learning environment that stimulates families and the community to provide optimal growth and development of children.

As we review the year, probably some of the most notable events were achieving NAEYC re-accreditation, building capacity by adding an additional 40 children, doubling the number of children we serve with special needs, and adding the Triple P parenting program! For 22 years now, Partners In Learning has maintained its mission to provide, in a fiscally responsible manner, early childhood education and therapeutic services to assist each child in reaching his or her highest potential. The year was also a milestone year for Partners In Learning financially. For the first time since we opened our Novant site in the fall, we are able to finish several months with a healthy and positive bottom line! This is in large part due to our high quality staff and reputation in the community which drove the increase in the number of children we serve at that site. We will continue to improve and expand programs and services, and diversify our funding sources. We want to maintain this level of success for the next 22 years and with your support, we know this is possible. Our door is always open for a tour of the facilities and we are eager to share the message of Partners In Learning to civic groups, youth organizations, and other community partners.


When Elsie started with us at the age of 16 months she was unable to sit up on her own, much less move on her own. She was in the toddler classroom for a year and half, in which she made tremendous growth. She learned how to pull herself up to the chair, push herself in her wheelchair, and speak in full sentences. Now she is in the preschool classroom where she has accomplished numerous independent skills including: maneuvering herself around the playground and classroom, climbing in and out of her car seat,

getting in and out of her wheelchair, pulling herself up to the sink to wash her hands, and many other self-care needs.

To provide high quality specialized education to all children, our staff participates in continual education and trainings. This year staff participated in over **18 different trainings**! Some topics included:

- Health, Safety, and Trauma in Children
- Social Emotional Foundations in Early Learning
- Fine and Gross Motor Development
- My Plate: Helping Children Make Healthy Food Choices
- Opportunities for Action: Advancing Early Education Through Policy and Advocacy
- Childhood Trauma
- Poverty Simulation Training

Impact and Growth



Our Family Support Services are designed to meet the individual need of families with children through resources and supportive services. These services include but are not limited to: Assist with conflicts between parents and staff in the classroom; Strategize with and family about environmental factors that contribute to behavioral issues; Provide resources for families to meet the needs of their child; Help families follow through with referrals to secure appropriate community resources for their child; Accompany families to appointments for support; Partner with the classroom teacher to resolve issues and more.

Thanks to a collaboration with Department of Social

Services, we were able to expand our Family Support Services to include the **Triple P Parenting Program!**This was huge in helping us to secure additional income while also meeting our mission of providing evidenced-based family support in our community. We now have seven staff members accredited in various levels of the program so we can provide the most comprehensive service in Rowan County.

The Triple P Parenting Program Builds on the strengths that all parents have, and teaching parent's new skills by recognizing that no child comes with an instructional manual. Benefits to Triple P include:

- Reduces Problem Behavior in children and improves parents' wellbeing and parenting skills...
- In communities where Triple P is widely available, children have fewer behavioral and emotional problems.
- Parents using Triple P report they are less stressed, less depressed, and don't use harsh discipline.
- Triple P can produce community-wide positive effects such as slowing the rate of child abuse and reducing foster care placements.

Quote from Triple P parent: "I definitely need to talk and figure out what I am doing wrong or what can make things better cause I feel like I am going to lose it sometimes".

In 2017/18 we served over 150,000 nutritionally balanced breakfasts, lunches and snacks!

451 area child care educators attended inclusion trainings

Over 2000 volunteer hours served by families and community

Our Plans for the Future: Come, Invest in our Future and Share in our Growth!

Building on our strong financial health and track record of providing quality early education, intervention, and family support services for our community children and families, our next challenges include:

- Closing the gap in teacher pay and providing additional education opportunities.
- Purchase two new buses, to replace our failing busses, so that we can invest our time in
 programing rather than bus repairs and worrying if it will be reliable for the next field trip. We also
 want to investigate how we might provide transportation for children to come to our center
 whose families may not have transportation.
- Expand our reach for Triple P Parenting Program and to be able to provide all of the levels of the program to further assist those families who need the most critical support.
- Enhancing our security features at our Novant location. Closed circuit camera system for entrances and playgrounds are a must. The camera and phone system in the classrooms are old and needs to be updated.
- Explore possible locations for a larger site to better meet the needs of our current growth

Clearly, these goals are an ambitious undertaking. To be successful, we will need the assistance of many people who care. People who care that our young children have a safe, nurturing place to go to during their pre-school years, and that families and the community will have the knowledge and skills necessary to contribute significantly to the optimal growth and development of children.

We don't let challenges define us!

This year we launched our Signature Scholarship Fundraiser; Just as I am: A Special Needs Fashion Show.

The actual cost of providing low ratios and highly specialized staff to serve special needs students far exceeds the cost we families can afford. Many of these families are at an economic disadvantage already due to the cost of multiple therapies. We want to ensure that the families we serve don't endure further financial hardships while providing their child with high quality <u>education</u>. Research shows that high quality <u>early education</u> and intensive early <u>intervention</u> can make a huge positive impact on that child's future.

Every child deserves the opportunity of early education! Remember children are our future!


