- Possess the Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) certificate or the willingness to complete the RBT certification
- Prior experience is not required (we offer paid training!) but successful candidates often have prior experience as a behavior technician, counselor, mental health technician, mental health therapist or social worker, or other experience in education, child care or human services.
- Demonstrated understanding of BACB Code of Ethics for RBTs.
